Accountant John Cullum, who announced that he will run for the office. Cullum previously ran against then-Rep. Loretta Sanchez, D-Santa Ana, in 2012 and 2014 but failed to make it out of the primary. He also ran unsuccessfully for Placentia City Council in 2002.

Former State Senate Republican Leader Bob Huff announced he will run for the Republican nomination to succeed Representative Ed Royce in California's 39th Congressional District. An experienced businessman and an accomplished legislator who has successfully advocated for leaner government, job creation and tax relief.



Young Kim is a long time **community leader** in North Orange County. A resident of Fullerton, Young is married to Charles Kim and all four of her children attended or currently attend Fullerton's public schools. Young served in the 65th Assembly seat and worked for Ed Royce for many years.

Currently serving as our **Orange County Supervisor, Shawn Nelson** announced his bid for the congressional seat. A conservative ready to secure our borders, keep taxes low, and fix our infrastructure. Shawn also previously served on the Fullerton City Council.

La Mirada City Councilman Andrew Sarega, 30, said he was committing \$200,000 of his own money to launch his campaign. Sarega is a retired Newport Beach police officer who was injured in the line of duty, according to the news release announcing his bid.

Sarega has occasionally butted heads with fellow council members. In the council's 2017 selection of mayor pro tem, Sarega was passed over for the third straight year with outgoing Mayor Steve De Ruse citing an attendance record that included 19 missed meetings. Sarega responded that he'd had personal issues, including three surgeries, according to the Whittier Daily News.
